



IMPORTANT: THE MOULDED PLUG

FOR YOUR SAFETY, PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING TEXT CAREFULLY.

This appliance is supplied with a moulded three pin mains plug for your safety and convenience. A 13 amp fuse is fitted in this plug. Should the fuse need to be replaced, please ensure that the replacement fuse has a rating of 13 amps and that it is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362.

Check for the ASTA mark # or the BSI mark $\overleftarrow{\nabla}$ on the body of the fuse.

If the plug contains a removable fuse cover, you must ensure that it is refitted when the fuse is replaced. If you lose the fuse cover, the plug must not be used until a replacement cover is obtained. A replacement fuse cover can be purchased from an Authorised Service Center.

If the fitted moulded plug is unsuitable for the mains socket in your home, then the fuse should be removed and the plug cut off and disposed of safely. There is a danger of severe electrical shock if the cut off plug is inserted into any 13 amp socket.

If a new plug is to be fitted, please observe the wiring code as shown below.

If in any doubt, please consult a qualified electrician.

IMPORTANT: The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

Green - and - Yellow: Earth
Blue: Neutral

As the colours of the wire in the mains lead of this appliance may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows.

The wire which is coloured GREEN - AND - YELLOW must be connected to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter E or by the Earth symbol $\frac{1}{2}$ or coloured GREEN or GREEN - AND - YELLOW.

The wire which is coloured BLUE must be connected to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter N or coloured BLACK.

The wire which is coloured BROWN must be connected to the terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter L or coloured RED.

How to replace the fuse: Open the fuse compartment with a screwdriver and replace the fuse.

WARNING:

■ POWER

The wall outlet or the circuit breaker shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible when problems occur. If the following problems occur, cut off the power supply immediately.

Continued use of the projector in these conditions will result in fire or electric shock.

- If foreign objects or water get inside the projector, cut off the power supply.
- If the projector is dropped or the cabinet is broken, cut off the power supply.
- If you notice smoke, strange smells or noise coming from the projector, cut off the power supply.

Please contact an Authorized Service Center for repairs, and do not attempt to repair the projector yourself.

During a thunderstorm, do not touch the projector or the cable.

Electric shocks can result.

Do not do anything that might damage the power cord or the power plug.

If the power cord is used while damaged, electric shocks, short-circuits or fire will result.

• Do not damage the power cord, make any modifications to it, place it near any hot objects, bend it excessively, twist it, pull it, place heavy objects on top of it or wrap it into a bundle.

Ask an Authorized Service Center to carry out any repairs to the power cord that might be necessary.

Completely insert the power plug into the wall outlet and the power connector into the projector terminal.

If the plug is not inserted correctly, electric shocks or overheating will result.

Do not use plugs which are damaged or wall outlets which are coming loose from the wall.

Do not use anything other than the provided power cord.

Failure to observe this will result in fire or electric shocks. Please note that if you do not use the provided power cord to ground the device on the side of the outlet, this may result in electric shocks.

Clean the power plug regularly to prevent it from becoming covered in dust.

Failure to observe this will cause a fire.

- If dust builds up on the power plug, the resulting humidity can damage the insulation.
- If not using the projector for an extended period of time, pull the power plug out from the wall outlet.

Pull the power plug out from the wall outlet and wipe it with a dry cloth regularly.

Do not handle the power plug and power connector with wet hands.

Failure to observe this will result in electric shocks.

Do not overload the wall outlet.

If the power supply is overloaded (ex., by using too many adapters), overheating may occur and fire will result.

■ ON USE/INSTALLATION

Do not place the projector on soft materials such as carpets or sponge mats.

Doing so will cause the projector to overheat, which can cause burns, fire or damage to the projector.

Do not set up the projector in humid or dusty places or in places where the projector may come into contact with oily smoke or steam.

Using the projector under such conditions will result in fire, electric shocks or deterioration of components. Oil may also distort the plastic and the projector could fall such as when mounted on the ceiling.

Do not install this projector in a place which is not strong enough to take the full weight of the projector or on top of a surface which is sloped or unstable.

Failure to observe this will cause projector to fall down or tip over the projector, and severe injury or damage could result.

Installation work (such as ceiling mount bracket) should only be carried out by a qualified technician.

If installation is not carried out and secured correctly, it can cause injury or accidents, such as electric shocks.

 Be sure to use the wire provided with the ceiling mount bracket as an extra safety measure to prevent the projector from falling down. (Install in a different location to the ceiling mount bracket.)

Do not cover the air intake/exhaust ports.

Doing so will cause the projector to overheat, which can cause fire or damage to the projector.

- Do not place the projector in narrow, badly ventilated places.
- Do not place the projector on cloth or papers, as these materials could be drawn into the air intake port.
- Provide at least 1 m (39-3/8") of space between any walls or objects and the exhaust port, and at least 50 cm (19-11/16") of space between any walls or objects and the intake port.

WARNING:

Do not place your hands or other objects close to the air exhaust port.

Doing so will cause burns or damage your hands or other objects.

 Heated air comes out of the air exhaust port. Do not place your hands or face, or objects which cannot withstand heat close to this port.

Do not look at and place your skin into the lights emitted from the lens while the projector is being used.

Doing so can cause burns or loss of sight.

- Strong light is emitted from the projector's lens. Do not look at or place your hands directly into this light.
- Be especially careful not to let young children look into the lens. In addition, turn off the power and disconnect the power plug when you are away from the projector.

Never attempt to remodel or disassemble the projector.

High voltages can cause fire or electric shocks.

• For any inspection, adjustment and repair work, please contact an Authorized Service Center.

Do not allow metal objects, flammable objects, or liquids to enter inside of the projector. Do not allow the projector to get wet.

Doing so may cause short circuits or overheating, and result in fire, electric shock, or malfunction of the projector.

- Do not place containers of liquid or metal objects near the projector.
- If liquid enters inside of the projector, consult your dealer.
- Particular attention must be paid to children.

Use the ceiling mount bracket specified by Panasonic.

Using the ceiling mount bracket other than the specified one will result in falling accidents.

Attach the supplied safety cable to the ceiling mount bracket to prevent the projector from falling down.

■ ACCESSORIES

Do not use or handle the batteries improperly, and refer to the following.

Failure to observe this will cause burns, batteries to leak, overheat, explode or catch fire.

- Do not use unspecified batteries.
- Do not charge dry cell batteries.
- Do not use chargeable batteries.
- Do not disassemble dry cell batteries.
- Do not heat the batteries or place them into water or fire.
- Do not allow the + and terminals of the batteries to come into contact with metallic objects such as necklaces or hairpins.
- Do not store or carry batteries together with metallic objects.
- Store the batteries in a plastic bag and keep them away from metallic objects.
- Make sure the polarities (+ and -) are correct when inserting the batteries.
- Do not use a new battery together with an old battery or mix different types of batteries.
- Do not use batteries with the outer cover peeling away or removed.

Do not allow children to reach the batteries.

Accidentally swallowing them can cause physical harm.

If swallowed, seek medical advice immediately.

If the battery fluid leaks, do not touch it with bare hands, and take the following measures if necessary.

If the lamp breaks, it could cause injury.

WARNING:

Lamp replacement

The lamp has high internal pressure. If improperly handled, an explosion and severe injury or accidents will result.

- The lamp can easily explode if struck against hard objects or dropped.
- Before replacing the lamp unit, be sure to turn the power off and to disconnect the power plug from the wall outlet. Electric shocks or explosions can result if this is not done.
- When replacing the lamp, turn the power off and allow the lamp it to cool for at least 1 hour before handling it otherwise it can cause burns.

Remove the depleted batteries from the remote control promptly.

• Leaving them in the unit may result in fluid leakage, overheating, or explosion of the batteries.

CAUTION:

■ POWER

When disconnecting the power cord, be sure to hold the power plug and power connector.

If the power cord itself is pulled, the lead will become damaged, and fire, short-circuits or serious electric shocks will result.

When not using the projector for an extended period of time, disconnect the power plug from the wall outlet.

Failure to do so may result in fire or electric shock.

Disconnect the power plug from the wall outlet before carrying out any cleaning and replacing the unit. Failure to do so may result in electric shock.

■ ON USE/INSTALLATION

Do not place heavy objects on top of the projector.

Failure to observe this will cause the projector to become unbalanced and fall, which could result in damage or injury. The projector will be damaged or deformed.

Do not put your weight on this projector.

You could fall or the projector could break, and injury will result.

• Be especially careful not to let young children stand or sit on the projector.

Do not place the projector in extremely hot locations.

Doing so will cause the outer casing or internal components to deteriorate, or result in fire.

• Take particular care in locations exposed to direct sunlight or near stoves.

Do not install the projector in a location where salt pollution or corrosive gas may occur.

Doing so may result in falling due to corrosion. Also, it may result in malfunctions.

Do not stand in front of the lens while the projector is being used.

Doing so can cause damage and burns to clothing.

• Strong light is emitted from the projector's lens.

Do not place objects in front of the lens while the projector is being used.

Doing so can cause fire, damage to an object, or malfunction of the projector.

• Strong light is emitted from the projector's lens.

Always disconnect all cables before moving the projector.

Moving the projector with cables still attached can damage the cables, which will cause fire or electric shocks to occur.

When mounting the projector on the ceiling, keep mounting screws and power cord from contact with metal parts inside the ceiling.

Contact with metal parts inside the ceiling can cause electric shocks.

Never plug headphones and earphones into <VARIABLE AUDIO OUT> terminal.

Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss.

Do not project an image with the lens cap attached.

Doing so can cause fire.

CAUTION:

■ ACCESSORIES

Do not use the old lamp unit.

If used it could cause lamp explosion.

If the lamp has broken, ventilate the room immediately. Do not touch or bring your face close to the broken pieces.

Failure to observe this will cause the user to absorb the gas which was released when the lamp broke and which contains nearly the same amount of mercury as fluorescent lamps, and the broken pieces will cause injury.

- If you believe that you have absorbed the gas or that the gas has got into your eyes or mouth, seek medical advice immediately.
- Ask your dealer about replacing the lamp unit and check the inside of the projector.

When not using the projector for an extended period of time, remove the batteries from the remote control.

Failure to observe this will cause the batteries to leak, overheat, catch fire or explode, which may result in fire or contamination of surrounding area.

Do not open the desiccant bag, or do not eat the contents.

If swallowed the contents of the desiccant bag accidentally, it may cause bad result to your body.

- If the desiccant gets into your eyes or mouth, immediately rinse with clean water and seek medical advice.
- Be especially careful not to let children reach the desiccant.

■ MAINTENANCE

Do not attach the air filter unit while it is wet.

Doing so may result in electric shock or malfunctions.

• After you clean the air filter units, dry them thoroughly before reattaching them.

Ask your dealer about cleaning inside the projector once a year.

Continuous use while dust is accumulated inside the projector may result in fire.





Após o uso, as pilhas e /ou baterias deverão ser entregues ao estabelecimento comercial ou rede de assistência técnica autorizada.

Cobrir os terminais positivo (+) e negativo (-) com uma fita isolante adesiva, antes de depositar numa caixa destinada para o recolhimento. O contato entre partes metálicas pode causar vazamentos, gerar calor, romper a blindagem e produzir fogo. (Fig. 1)

Não desmonte, não remova o invólucro, nem amasse a bateria. O gás liberado pela bateria pode irritar a garganta, danificar o lacre do invólucro ou o vazamento provocar calor, ruptura da blindagem e produzir fogo devido ao curto circuito dos terminais. Não incinere nem aqueça as baterias, elas não podem ficar expostas a temperaturas superiores a 100 °C (212 °F). O gás liberado pela bateria pode irritar a garganta, danificar o lacre do invólucro ou o vazamento provocar calor, ruptura da blindagem e produzir fogo devido ao curto circuito dos terminais provocado internamente.



Chapter 1 Preparation

This chapter describes things you need to know or check before using the projector.

Precautions for use

Cautions when transporting

- When transporting the projector, hold it securely by its bottom and avoid excessive vibration and impacts. Doing so may damage the internal parts and result in malfunctions.
- Do not transport the projector with the adjustable feet extended. Doing so may damage the adjustable feet.

Cautions when installing

■ Do not set up the projector outdoors.

The projector is designed for indoor use only.

■ Do not use under the following conditions.

- Places where vibration and impacts occur such as in a car or vehicle: Doing so may damage the internal parts and result in malfunctions.
- Location close to sea or where corrosive gas may occur: the projector may fall due to corrosion. Also, failure to do so may shorten the life of the components and result in malfunction.
- Near the exhaust of an air conditioner: Depending on the conditions of use, the screen may fluctuate in rare
 cases due to the heated air from the air exhaust port or the hot or cooled air. Make sure that the exhaust
 from the projector or other equipment, or the air from the air conditioner does not blow toward the front of the
 projector.
- Places with sharp temperature fluctuations such as near lights (studio lamps): Doing so may shorten the life of
 the luminous lamp, or result in deformation of the outer case due to heat, which may cause malfunction. Make
 sure to observe the operating temperature range of the projector.
- Near high-voltage power lines or near motors: Doing so may interfere with the operation of the projector.

■ Be sure to ask a specialized technician or your dealer when installing the product to a ceiling.

This requires an optional ceiling mount bracket. Be sure to use the Projector Mount Bracket together with the ceiling mount bracket for high ceilings or low ceilings.

- ① ET-PKL100H (for high ceilings), ET-PKV400B (Projector Mount Bracket)
- ② ET-PKL100S (for low ceilings), ET-PKV400B (Projector Mount Bracket)

■ Focus adjustment

The projection lens is thermally affected by the light from the light source, making the focus unstable in the period just after switching on the power. It is recommended that the images are projected continuously for at least 30 minutes before the focus is adjusted.

■ Do not install the projector at elevations of 2 700 m (8 858') or higher above sea level.

■ Do not use the projector in a location that the ambient temperature exceed 40 °C (104 °F).


Using the projector in a location that the altitude is too high or the ambient temperature is too high may shorten the life of the components or result in malfunctions.

The upper limit of the operating temperature of the projector varies depending on the altitudes of the operating environment.

When using it at altitudes below 1 200 m (3 937') above sea level: 0 °C (32 °F) \sim 40 °C (104 °F) When using it at altitudes between 1 200 m (3 937') and 2 700 m (8 858') above sea level: 0 °C (32 °F) \sim 30 °C (86 °F)

■ Do not tilt the projector or place it on its side.


Do not tilt the projector body more than approximately ±30 degrees longitudinally or ±15 degrees laterally. Over tilting may result in shortening the life of the components.



Cautions when setting the projectors


- Use the adjustable feet only for the floor standing installation and for adjusting the angle. Using them for other purposes may damage the projector.
- When installing the projector with a method other than the floor installation using the adjustable feet or the
 ceiling installation, use the four screw holes for ceiling mount (as shown in the figure) to fix the projector to the
 mount. For details about the screw hole position for ceiling mount, refer to "Screw hole specifications for ceiling
 mount" (→ page 132).

(Screw diameter: M4, tapping depth inside the projector: 8 mm (5/16"), torque: $1.25 \pm 0.2 \text{ N} \cdot \text{m}$) In such case, make sure that there is no clearance between the screw holes for ceiling mount on the projector bottom and the setting surface by inserting spacers (metallic).



Positions of screw holes for ceiling mount and adjustable feet

- Do not stack the projectors.

Also, maintenance can be performed in advance, because this software gives notification of approximate time to replace consumables of the display, to clean each part of the display, and to replace the components of the display.

Depending on the type of license, the number of displays that can be registered for monitoring varies. Limited to the first 90 days after installation in a computer, it is possible to register up to 2048 units of displays free of charge.

Cautions on use

■ To get a good picture quality

In order to view a beautiful image in higher contrast, prepare an appropriate environment. Draw curtains or blinds over windows and turn off any lights near the screen to prevent outside light or light from indoor lamps from shining onto the screen.

■ Projection lens

Do not touch the surface of the projector lens with your bare hands.

If the surface of the lens becomes dirty from fingerprints or anything else, this will be magnified and projected onto the screen.

It is recommended to attach the supplied lens cap to the projection lens when you do not use the projector.

• Do not wipe the lens during operation.

Cleaning the lens during operation may cause foreign objects adhering to the lens or bring damage to the lens surface.

■ LCD panel

The LCD panel is precision-made. Note that in rare cases, pixels could be missing or always lit. Note that such phenomena do not indicate malfunction.

If still images are projected for a long time, a residual image may remain on the LCD panel. In this case, project the all white screen for over an hour. Note that the residual image may not disappear.

Optical parts

When the operating environment temperature is high or in environments where lots of dust, cigarette smoke, etc. is present, the replacement cycle of the LCD panel, polarizing plate and other optical parts may be shorter even if used for less than one year. Consult your dealer for details.

Luminous lamp

The light source of the projector is a high-pressure mercury lamp.

A high-pressure mercury lamp has the following characteristics.

- The luminance of the luminous lamp will decrease by duration of usage.
- The luminous lamp may burst with a loud sound or have its service life shortened because of shock, chipping, or degradation due to cumulative runtime.
- The luminous lamp life varies greatly depending on individual differences and usage conditions. In particular, continuous use for 12 hours or more and frequent off/on switching of the power greatly deteriorate the luminous lamp and affect the luminous lamp life.
- In rare cases, the luminous lamp burst shortly after the projection.
- The risk of bursting increases when the luminous lamp is used beyond its replacement cycle. Make sure to replace the lamp unit according to the proper replacement time ("When to replace the lamp unit" (**) page 114) and "How to replace the lamp unit" (**) page 115))
- If the luminous lamp bursts, gas contained inside of the luminous lamp is released in a form of smoke.
- It is recommended to store replacement lamps for contingency.

About Initial setting, please refer to "When the initial setting screen is displayed" (\Rightarrow page 40).

The factory default ID number of the unit (the projector and the remote control) is set to [ALL], you can control with this setting. If necessary, please set the ID number to the remote control and the projector. About how to set the ID number of the remote control, please refer to "Setting the ID number of the remote control" (*) page 51).




When moving this projector or while not using it over an extended period of time, it is recommended to attach the lens cap to avoid contaminating the lens.

2) Thread the other side (the side with larger ring) of the string through the hole at the bottom of the projector and fasten it.




Chapter 2 Getting Started


This chapter describes things you need to do before using the projector such as the setup and connections.

Setting up

Installation mode

There are four ways to set up the projector. Set the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu \rightarrow [PROJECTION METHOD] (\Rightarrow page 79) depending on the installation mode.






Note

The projector has a built-in angle sensor. The attitude of the projector is automatically detected by setting the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu
 → [PROJECTION METHOD] to [AUTO]. For rear projection, set the [PROJECTION METHOD] to [REAR/DESK] or [REAR/CEILING].

■ Angle sensor

The range of installation posture detected by the projector's built-in angle sensor is as follows.

In case of [AUTO], when the projector is placed with the top side upward within $\pm 30^{\circ}$ from the horizontal plane, it will switch to [FRONT/DESK] automatically; when the projector is placed with the top side downward within $\pm 30^{\circ}$ from the horizontal plane, it will switch to [FRONT/CEILING] automatically. Although it is detected as [FRONT/DESK] even when it exceeds $\pm 30^{\circ}$ with respect to the horizontal plane, do not use such installation posture in this range.



Attention

• The angle sensor cannot detect whether it is the "Installation prohibited posture" in the above figure. Do not use the projector tilted at an angle that exceeds ±30° from the horizontal plane. It may reduce the life of the components. (▶ page 16)

Parts for ceiling mount (optional)

This requires an optional ceiling mount bracket. Be sure to use the Projector Mount Bracket together with the ceiling mount bracket for high ceilings or low ceilings.





Connecting

Before connecting

- Before connecting, carefully read the operating instructions for the external device to be connected.
- Turn off the power switch of the devices before connecting cables.
- Take note of the following points before connecting the cables. Failure to do so may result in malfunctions.
 - When connecting a cable to the projector or an external device connected to the projector, touch any nearby metallic objects to eliminate static electricity from your body before performing work.
 - Do not use unnecessarily long cables to connect to the projector or a device connected to the projector. The longer the cable, the more it is susceptible to noise. Since using a cable while it is wound makes it act like an antenna, it is more susceptible to noise.
 - When connecting cables, connect GND first, then insert the connecting terminal of the connecting device straightly.
- If any connection cable is not supplied with the device, or if no optional cable is available for connection of the device, prepare a necessary system connection cable to suit the device.
- Video signals from the video devices containing too much jitter may cause the images on the screen to randomly wobble or wafture. In this case, a time base corrector (TBC) must be connected.
- The projector supports VIDEO signals, YC_BC_R/YP_BP_R signals, analog RGB signals (synchronous signals are TTL level), and digital signal.
- Some computer models or graphics cards are not compatible with the projector.
- When using long cables to connect each equipment to the projector, there is a possibility that the image will not be output correctly unless a cable compensator is used.
- For details on what video signals the projector supports, refer to "List of compatible signals". (▶ page 126)




Attention

- · Always use one of the following when connecting a VCR.
 - A VCR with built-in time base corrector (TBC).
 - A time base corrector (TBC) between the projector and the VCR.
- If nonstandard burst signals are connected, the image may be distorted. In such case, connect the time base corrector (TBC) between the projector and the external devices.

Note

- For an HDMI cable, use an HDMI High Speed cable that conforms to HDMI standards. If a cable that does not conform to HDMI standards is used, images may be interrupted or may not be displayed.
- The <HDMI 1 IN> terminal /<HDMI 2 IN> terminal can be connected to an external device with the DVI-D terminal by using an HDMI/DVI conversion cable. However, this may not function properly for some external devices, and image may not be projected.
- This projector does not support the VIERA Link (HDMI).
- To output the signal input to the <COMPUTER 1 IN> terminal from the <COMPUTER 2 IN/1 OUT> terminal, set the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu
 → [COMPUTER2 SELECT] to [COMPUTER 1 OUT].
- To output audio, properly set the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [AUDIO SETTING] → [AUDIO IN SELECT].
- When the <VARIABLE AUDIO OUT> terminal is connected with cable, the sound will not be output from the built-in speaker.

Connecting example: Computers



Attention

When connecting the projector to a computer or an external device, use the power cord supplied with each device and commercially
available shielded cables.

Note

- For the HDMI cable, use an HDMI High Speed cable that conforms to the HDMI standards. If a cable that does not conform to the HDMI standards is used, images may be interrupted or may not be projected.
- If you operate the projector using the computer with the resume feature (last memory), you may have to reset the resume feature to operate
 the projector.
- To output the signal input to the <COMPUTER 1 IN> terminal from the <COMPUTER 2 IN/1 OUT> terminal, set the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu
 → [COMPUTER2 SELECT] to [COMPUTER1 OUT].

Chapter 3 Basic Operations

This chapter describes basic operations to start with.

Switching on/off the projector


Connecting the power cord

Make sure that the supplied power cord is securely fixed to the projector body to prevent it from being removed easily.

Use the power cord matching with the power supply voltage and the shape of the outlet.

For details of power cord handling, refer to "Read this first!". (▶ page 4)

Attaching the power cord



1) Check the shapes of the <AC IN> terminal on the back of the projector body and the power cord connector and insert the plug completely in the correct direction (until you hear the side tabs click in place).

Removing the power cord




- 1) Confirm that the projector is in standby mode, and remove the power plug from the outlet.
- 2) Remove the power cord connector from the <AC IN> terminal of the projector body while pressing the side tabs.

Power indicator

Displays the status of the power. Check the <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> status of the power indicator before operating the projector.

Power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)>





- While the power indicator <ON (G)/STANDBY (R)> lights in orange, the fan is running to cool the projector.
- For about 90 seconds after the projector is switched off, the luminous lamp does not light up even if the power is switched on. Turn on the power again after the power indicator <ON (G)/STANDBY (R)> lights/blinks in red.
- The projector consumes power even in standby mode (power indicator <ON (G)/STANDBY (R)> lights/blinks in red). Refer to "Power consumption" (→ page 128) for the power consumption.

Switching on the projector

Before switching on the projector, make sure all the other devices are correctly connected (page 34) and the lens cap is removed beforehand.



- 1) Connect the power cord to the projector.
- 2) Connect the power plug to an outlet.
 - The power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights/blinks, and the projector will enter the standby mode.
- 3) Press the power <७/ |> button.
 - The power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights in green and the image is soon projected on the screen.

Attention

• Be sure to remove the lens cap before starting projection.

Note

- If the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [ECO MANAGEMENT] → [STANDBY MODE] is set to [ECO] (→ page 81), it may take
 approximately ten seconds longer before the projector starts projecting after the power is turned on, compared with when [NORMAL] is set.
- If the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [ECO MANAGEMENT] → [STANDBY MODE] is set to [NORMAL], it may take approximately one
 minute to enable the network function after connecting the power cord to the outlet.

When the initial setting screen is displayed

When the projector is switched on for the first time after purchase or the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [INITIALIZE ALL] is executed, the **[INITIAL SETTING]** screen is displayed after the projection starts. Set them in accordance with circumstances. In other occasions, you can change the settings by menu operations. When the **[INITIAL SETTING]** screen is displayed, you can return to the previous screen by pressing the <MENU> button.

Note

When the projector is used for the first time, in order to clearly display the menu screen, it may be necessary to adjust the focus lever and the
zoom lever in the projection lens area of the projector (→ page 23). For details, refer to "How to adjust the state of the image" (→ page 45).

Initial setting (display language)

Select the language to show on the screen.

After the initial setting, you can change the display language from the [LANGUAGE] menu.


1) Press ▲▼◀▶ to select the display language.



2) Press the <ENTER> button to proceed to the following initial setting.

Initial setting (projector setup)

If necessary, change the setting of each item.



1) Press ▲▼ to select an item.

- 2) Press **♦** to switch the setting.
 - When all settings are completed, proceed to Step 3).
- 3) Press the <ENTER> button.
 - Confirm the setting value and complete the initial setting.

Setting [PROJECTION METHOD]

If the screen display is upside down or is reversed, please change the settings, refer to "Installation mode" (→ page 29). After initialization, You can change the settings from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [PROJECTION METHOD].

- 1) Press ▲▼ to select the [PROJECTION METHOD].
- 2) Press **♦** to switch the settings.
 - When set to [AUTO], the built-in angle sensor detects the orientation of the projector and automatically switches to [FRONT/DESK] or [FRONT/CEILING]. Normally, set to [AUTO].
 - To project from the rear of the screen, select [REAR/DESK] or [REAR/CEILING] (using a translucent screen).

Setting [SCREEN FORMAT] and [SCREEN POSITION]

Set the image aspect ratio and display position according to the screen being used. When the initial setting is complete, you can change the setting from the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu \rightarrow [SCREEN SETTING] \rightarrow [SCREEN FORMAT]/[SCREEN POSITION].

- Press ▲▼ to select the [SCREEN FORMAT].
- 2) Press **♦** to select the aspect ratio.
- 3) Press ▲▼ to select the [SCREEN POSITION].
 - In the following cases, the [SCREEN POSITION] cannot be changed.
 - For PT-VZ580 and PT-VW540, [SCREEN FORMAT] is set to [16:10].
 - For PT-VX610, [SCREEN FORMAT] is set to [4:3].
- 4) Press **♦** to select the image position.
 - Select from [CENTER]/[LEFT]/[RIGHT] or [CENTER]/[UPPER]/[LOWER].


Setting [STANDBY MODE]

Set the operating mode at standby. When the initial setting is complete, you can change the setting from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu \rightarrow [ECO MANAGEMENT] \rightarrow [STANDBY MODE].

- 1) Press ▲▼ to select [STANDBY MODE].
- 2) Press **♦** to select the operation mode.
 - The factory default setting is [NORMAL], which enables the network function even in standby mode.
 - To lower the power consumption level during standby, set to [ECO].

Making adjustments and selections

It is recommended that images are projected continuously for at least 30 minutes before the focus is adjusted.




- Roughly adjust the focus of the image with the focus lever. (→ page 45)
- 2) Change the settings of the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [PROJECTION METHOD] depending on the installation mode. (→ page 29)
 - Refer to "Navigating through the menu" (→ page 53) for the operation of the menu screen.
- 3) Press the input selection buttons on the remote control or the <INPUT SELECT> button on the control panel to select the input signal. (▶ page 44)
 - The buttons that can be used on the remote control are as follows.
 COMPUTER 1> button, <COMPUTER 2> button, <VIDEO> button, <HDMI 1> button, and <HDMI 2> button
- 4) Adjust the front, back and sideway tilt of the projector with the adjustable feet. (▶ page 46)
- 5) Adjust the size of the image to match the screen with the zoom lever.
- 6) Adjust the vertical projection position with the vertical lens shift dial.
- If the input signal is an analog RGB signal, press the <AUTO SETUP> button.
- 8) Adjust the focus again with the focus lever.
- 9) Adjust the size of the image to match the screen with the zoom lever again.

Note

• When the projector is switched on for the first time after purchase or the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [INITIALIZE ALL] is executed, the [INITIAL SETTING] screen is displayed after projection starts. Refer to "When the initial setting screen is displayed" (♠ page 40).

Switching off the projector



- 1) Press the power <७/1> button.
 - The [POWER OFF] confirmation screen is displayed.

- 2) Press ◀▶ to select [OK], and press the <ENTER> button. (Or press the power <⊕/|> button again.)
 - Projection of the image will stop, and the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> on the projector lights in orange. (The fans keep running.)
- 3) Wait until the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> on the projector lights or blinks in red.
 - The projector enters standby mode when the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> lights or blinks in red.
- 4) Disconnect the plug of the power cord from the outlet.

- While the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> is lighting in orange, the luminous lamp is being cooled down and the projector cannot be turned on. Wait until the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> starts lighting or blinking in red to turn on the projector again.
- Even if the power is turned off by pressing the power < 0/1> button, the projector consumes power if the power plug is connected to the outlet.
 - When the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu \rightarrow [ECO MANAGEMENT] \rightarrow [STANDBY MODE] is set to [ECO], use of some functions is restricted, but the power consumption during standby can be conserved.

Direct power off function

When the plug is disconnected from the outlet or the power is turned off by the circuit breaker in the ceiling mount case while the projection is going on, the projector can respond with direct power off function. Therefore, it is also safe in case a power outage occurs or the power cord is pulled out immediately after the projector is switched off.

Attention

Do not disconnect the power cord from the wall outlet or turn off the circuit breaker switch in about 1 minute after the lamp is lit. Doing so
may cause the lamp fail to light while you powering on the projector next time, or result in premature deterioration of the luminous lamp.

Note

- If the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [INITIAL STARTUP] is set to [LAST MEMORY] and the projector was turned off by using the circuit
 breaker directly while projecting during the last time of use, the power indicator <ON(G)/STANDBY(R)> will light in green a while after the
 circuit breaker is turned on, and then projection of the image will start.
- If the projector is shut down with the direct power off function, it may take longer than usual to be ready for projection when the projector is switched on the next time.


Projecting

Check the connections of the external devices (→ page 34) and connection of the power cord (→ page 38) and then power on the projector (→ page 39) to start projecting. Select the image and adjust the state of the image.

Selecting the image input for projection

Switch the image input for projection. Method to switch the input is as follows.

- Press the input selection buttons on the remote control and directly specify the input to project.
- Press the <INPUT SELECT> button on the control panel to display the input guide and select the input to be projected.



Switching the input directly with the remote control

The input for projection can be switched by directly specifying it with the input selection button on the remote control.

1) Press the input selection buttons (<COMPUTER 1>, <COMPUTER 2>, <VIDEO>, <HDMI 1>, <HDMI 2>).



When switching inputs, the input guide for detailed or simple display is temporarily displayed. For the input guide, refer to "Switching the input with the control panel" (→ page 45) or the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu → [ON-SCREEN DISPLAY] → [INPUT GUIDE].

Attention

- Images may not be projected properly depending on the external device, or the Blu-ray disc or DVD disc, to be played back. Set the following menu items according to the input signal.
 - [PICTURE] menu → [TV-SYSTEM]
 - [PICTURE] menu \rightarrow [RGB/YC_BC_R]
 - [PICTURE] menu \rightarrow [RGB/YP_BP_R]
 - [PICTURE] menu → [RGB-SYSTEM]
- Confirm the aspect ratio of the projection screen and the image, and switch to an optimum aspect ratio from the [POSITION] menu →
 [ASPECT].

- Set the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [COMPUTER2 SELECT] to [COMPUTER2 IN] when a signal is to be input to the <COMPUTER 2 IN/1 OUT> terminal. When [COMPUTER2 SELECT] is set to [COMPUTER1 OUT], it cannot switch to COMPUTER 2 input.
- If one of COMPUTER 1 / COMPUTER 2 / HDMI 1 / HDMI 2 input is selected and no signal is input, the following screen is displayed. Check the output setting of your computer.



Switching the input with the control panel

The input can be switched with the <INPUT SELECT> button on the control panel After pressing the <INPUT SELECT> button, the detailed or simple input guide is displayed.

- 1) Press the <INPUT SELECT> button on the control panel.
 - The input guide is displayed.
- 2) Press the <INPUT SELECT> button again.
 - Every time you press the <INPUT SELECT> button, the inputs are switched in the following order.
 COMPUTER1 → COMPUTER2 → HDMI1 → HDMI2 → VIDEO → COMPUTER1 → ...
 - When the detailed input guide is displayed, you can select the input with the ◀▶ buttons on the control panel or on the remote control.

Note

- $\bullet \ \ \text{You can switch the detailed/simple input guide by setting the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu} \rightarrow [\text{ON-SCREEN DISPLAY}] \rightarrow [\text{INPUT GUIDE}].$
- When the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu → [ON-SCREEN DISPLAY] → [INPUT GUIDE] is set to [OFF], the input guide is not displayed.

How to adjust the state of the image

If the projected image or the position is not correct when the positioning of the projector and the screen is correctly installed, adjust the projection angle, zoom, focus and vertical shift.




1) Adjust the projection angle.

- Place the projector on a level surface and make its front side parallel to the screen surface so that the projection screen is rectangular.
- If the projector is facing downward with respect to the screen, extend the adjustable feet and adjust the
 projected image so that the projected image is rectangular. For details, refer to "Adjusting adjustable feet".
 (*) page 46)

2) Adjust the zoom and the focus. (Fig. 1)

- Operate the zoom lever to adjust the projected image size to fit the screen.
- Operate the focus lever to adjust the focus.

3) Adjust the vertical shift. (Fig. 2)


• Turn the vertical lens shift dial and adjust the vertical projection position on the screen. For details, refer to "Adjusting the projection position with the optical axis shift function". (*) page 47)

Note

- It is recommended that the images are projected continuously for at least 30 minutes before the focus is adjusted.
- When the focus is adjusted, the projection screen size also changes slightly. Depending on the image projection situation, repeat Steps 1) to
 3) to adjust to the best projection condition.
- Adjust from the [POSITION] menu → [SCREEN ADJUSTMENT] when the projected image is distorted.

Adjusting adjustable feet

By pressing the adjustable feet lock with your finger, the adjustable feet lock is released and becomes free. It will be locked when you release the finger. Lift the front side of the projector while pressing the adjustable feet lock with your finger, and release your finger until the projection position is aligned. If fine adjustment of the projection position is necessary, adjust the adjustable feet by turning them. Turn the adjustable feet counterclockwise as shown in the figure to extend them. Also, turning them clockwise will return to the original status.



Maximum adjustable range Adjustable feet : 34 mm (1-11/32") each

Attention

Heated air is expelled from the air exhaust port. Do not touch the air exhaust port directly when adjusting the adjustable feet while using the
projector. (*page 23)

Note


When turning the adjustable feet clockwise until a click sound is heard, the adjustable feet change to its minimum length.

Adjusting the projection position with the optical axis shift function

This projector is equipped with vertical optical axis shift function. The projection position can be adjusted in the range shown in the following figure with the optical axis shift function based on the position of the projected screen in the home position (standard projection position).

When the projector is installed on the desk, the projected image will move upward if you turn the vertical lens shift dial clockwise and will move downward if you turn it counterclockwise.

The following figure shows the adjustment range when the projector is installed on the desk.



Note

• The standard projection position indicates the projection screen position in the state without vertical shift adjustment. At this time, the vertical lens shift dial is fully turned counterclockwise.

Operating with the remote control



Using the AV mute function

If the projector is not used for a certain period of time during meeting breaks or preparations, for example, it is possible to turn off the audio and image temporarily.

Using the freeze function

You can freeze the projected image and mute the sound temporarily, regardless of the playback status of the external device.

FREEZE button

 - The image is paused and the audio is muted.
- 2) Press the <FREEZE> button again.
 - The image resumes and the audio is output.

Note

• [FREEZE] is displayed at the lower left of the projection screen in freeze status.

Using the auto setup function

The automatic setup function can be used to automatically adjust the dot clock, clock phase, and image position when the analog RGB signals consisting of bitmap images such as computer signal are input. It is recommended to input an image with bright white borders at the edges and high-contrast black and white characters when the automatic adjustment is being performed. Images including half tones like photos and computer graphics are not suitable.

- You can also use this function with the <AUTO SETUP> button on the control panel.
- The clock phase may shift even if the automatic adjustment is performed. In such a case, adjust the [POSITION] menu → [CLOCK PHASE].

- When the input signal is a blurred-edge image or a dark image, it may not be able to be adjusted correctly even if the automatic adjustment is performed. In this case, adjust the following settings.
 - [POSITION] menu → [DOT CLOCK] (→ page 66)
 - [POSITION] menu → [CLOCK PHASE] (→ page 66)
 - [POSITION] menu → [SHIFT] (page 65)
- Automatic adjustment may not be performed depending on the computer model and input signal.
- Images may be disrupted for a few seconds during automatic adjustment, but it is not a malfunction.
- Automatic adjustment can be canceled by pressing any button on the remote control during the automatic adjustment operation.
- If the automatic setup function is used while moving images are being input, the adjustment may not be performed properly even for a signal
 that can use automatic setup.

Using the screen adjustment function

The [SCREEN ADJUSTMENT] menu can be displayed.

You can correct the distortion of the projected image that occurs when the projector is installed tilted or when the screen is tilted or curved.

 <ENTER> button to show the individual adjustment screen and adjust with ▲▼◀▶.
- · When an individual adjustment screen is displayed, pressing the <ENTER> button can switch to another adjustment screen.

- When using the digital zoom function, the magnification can be set from 1.0x to 3.0x with 0.1 increments when the <D.ZOOM -> button / <D.ZOOM +> button is pressed.
- When the image enlarged to 1.1 to 3.0 times is displayed, the enlarged area can be moved by pressing ▲▼◀▶.
- When the freeze function is being used, the digital zoom function is disabled.
- The digital zoom function may not work properly depending on the input signals.

Using the FUNCTION button

Some frequently used menu items can be assigned to the <FUNCTION> button on the remote control so that it can be used as an shortcut button.

Using the presentation timer function

You can operate the presentation timer.

Presentations, etc. can be performed while checking the elapsed time or time remaining in the preset time.

P-TIMER 3 button

- 1) Press the <P-TIMER> button.
 - The count is started.
- 2) Press the <P-TIMER> button again.
 - The count is stopped.

Note

- The elapsed time or the remaining time is displayed at the lower right of the projected image when using the presentation timer function.
- The count will be resumed from interruption when the <P-TIMER> button is pressed.
- The presentation timer function will be terminated by pressing the <P-TIMER> button for over three seconds
- For details about the setting of the presentation timer function, refer to the [DISPLAY OPTION] menu → [P-TIMER] (→ page 75).

Setting the ID number on the remote control

When you use the system with multiple projectors, you can operate all the projectors simultaneously or each projector individually by using single remote control, if unique ID number is assigned to each projector. After setting the ID number of the projector, set the same ID number to the remote control.

The factory default ID number of the projector is set to [ALL]. When using a single projector, press the <ID ALL> button on the remote control. Also, you can control a projector by pressing the <ID ALL> button on the remote control even if you do not know the projector ID.

- 1) Press the <ID SET> button on the remote control.

 - If you press the <ID ALL> button, you can control the projectors regardless of the ID number setting of the projector.

Attention

- Since the ID number of the remote control can be set without the projector, do not press the <ID SET> button on the remote control
 carelessly. If the <ID SET> button is pressed and no number (<1> <6>) buttons are pressed within five seconds, the ID number returns to
 its original value before the <ID SET> button was pressed.
- The ID number set on the remote control will be stored unless it is set again. However, it will be erased if the remote control is left with dead
 batteries. Set the same ID number again when the batteries are replaced.

Note

Set the ID number of the projector from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [PROJECTOR ID].

Chapter 4 Settings

This chapter describes the settings and adjustments you can make using the on-screen menu.

On-screen menu









 - Depending on the item, each time you press the ◀▶ button, items are switched in order as shown below.



 Depending on the item, each time you press the ◀▶ button, the individual adjustment screen with a bar scale is displayed as shown below.



- Pressing the <MENU> button while the menu screen is displayed will return the previous menu. You can operate in the same way by pressing
 the <RETURN> button.
- Some items may not be adjusted or used depending on the selected signals or input signals to the projector. The menu items that cannot be adjusted or used are shown in gray characters, and they cannot be selected.
- · Some items can be adjusted even if signals are not input.
- · Individual adjustment screen disappears automatically if no operation is performed within approximately five seconds.
- For menu items, refer to "Main menu" (→ page 54) and "Sub menu" (→ page 55).

Resetting adjustment values to the factory default

If the <DEFAULT> button on the remote control is pressed, the values adjusted in the menu items are restored to the factory default settings.







Network connection

This projector has network function that allows the following by connecting a computer.

WEB control

By accessing the projector from a computer, you can perform setting, adjustment, status display, etc. of the projector. Refer to "Web control function" (** page 94) for details.

Multi Monitoring & Control Software

"Multi Monitoring & Control Software" is used to monitor and control multiple display devices (projector or flat panel display) connected via LAN.

Refer to the Operating Instructions of the "Multi Monitoring & Control Software" in the supplied CD-ROM for details.

Early Warning Software

"Early Warning Software" is used to monitor the status of the display devices (projector or flat panel display) or the peripheral device within the intranet, and to notify the problem or to detect the sign of possible problem of the device.

PJLink


Operation or status query of the projector can be performed from a computer with the PJLink protocol. Refer to "PJLink protocol" (▶ page 119) for details.

Command control

Operation or status query of the projector can be performed from a computer with the control commands. Refer to "Control commands via LAN" (*) page 120) for details.

Connecting via wired LAN

Example of a network connection



Attention

When a LAN cable is directly connected to the projector, cabling must be made indoors.

Note

- A LAN cable is required to use the wired LAN function.
- Use a straight or crossover LAN cable that is compatible with CAT5 or higher. Either the straight or the crossover cable, or both cables
 can be used depending on the system configuration, check with your network administrator. The projector identifies the type of the cable
 (straight or crossover) automatically.
- Use a LAN cable of 100 m (328'1") or shorter.

Projector settings

- 1) Connect the projector to a computer using a LAN cable.
- 2) Turn on the power of the projector.

This chapter describes methods of inspection when there are problems, maintenance and replacement of the units.


Lamp and temperature indicators

When an indicator lights up

If a problem should occur inside the projector, the lamp indicator <LAMP> and the temperature indicator <TEMP> will inform you by lighting or blinking. Check the status of the indicators and remedy the indicated problems as follows.

Attention

Before you take a remedial measure, follow the procedure of switching the power off indicated in "Switching off the projector". (→ page 42)

- When the projector is used with the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [LAMP POWER] set to [NORMAL], the [LAMP POWER] will be forcibly switched to [ECO1] to protect the projector if the operating environment temperature exceeds 35 °C (95 °F).

Before performing maintenance/replacement

- Make sure to turn off the power before maintaining the projector or replacing the unit.
- When switching off the projector, make sure to follow the procedures in "Switching off the Projector". (→ page 42)

Maintenance

Outer case

Wipe off dirt and dust with a soft, dry cloth.

- If the dirt is persistent, soak the cloth with water and wring it thoroughly before wiping. Dry off the projector with a dry cloth.
- Do not use benzene, thinner, or rubbing alcohol, other solvents, or household cleaners. Doing so may deteriorate the outer case.
- When using chemically treated dust cloths, follow the instructions written on its packaging.

Lens front surface

Wipe off dirt and dust from the front surface of the lens with a soft clean cloth.

- Do not use a cloth that is fluffy, dusty, or soaked with oil/water.
- Since the lens is fragile, do not use excessive force when wiping the lens.

Attention

• The lens is made of glass. Impacts or excessive force when wiping may scratch its surface. Handle with care.



DO NOT WIPE THE LENS DURING OPERATION.

Cleaning the lens during operation may cause foreign objects adhering to the lens or bring damage to the lens surface.

Air filter unit

This section describes the maintenance of the air filter unit that is installed as standard on the projector.

The air filter unit is the same as the optional Replacement Filter Unit (Model No.: ET-RFV410).

In the following cases, remove the air filter unit and check the clogging condition of the air filter. If the air filter is clogged, clean the air filter unit.

- A temperature warning message is displayed on the projection screen.
- The temperature indicator <TEMP> lights in red in the projection state.
- The temperature indicator <TEMP> blinks in red in the standby state.
- The message of "FILTER COUNTER has reached the set time." that prompts to perform maintenance of the air filter unit is displayed on the projection screen.


Attention

- Make sure to turn off the power before performing maintenance of the air filter. (→ pages 38, 42)
- Make sure that the projector is stable, and perform the maintenance in a safe place even if the filter falls accidentally.

Note

- $\bullet \ \ \, \text{Check the usage time of the air filter in the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu} \rightarrow \text{[FILTER COUNTER]}.$
- · Air filter replacement is recommended after washing the air filter two times for recycling.
- The air filter performance after washing may be reduced compared with its initial performance.
- The time until the air filter is clogged varies greatly depending on the usage environment.

Removing the air filter unit



1) Turn off the projector.

When switching off the projector, make sure to follow the procedures in "Switching off the projector"
 (*) page 42).

2) Remove the air filter cover. (Fig. 1)

• Push the tabs of the air filter cover upward as shown in the figure, remove them from the hooks of the projector and open it in the direction of the arrow in the figure.


3) Remove the air filter unit. (Fig. 2)

- Put your finger on the tab on the left side of the air filter unit, open it in the direction of the arrow shown in the figure and remove it.
- After removing the air filter unit, remove the foreign objects and dust in the air filter unit compartment if there are any.
- After removing the air filter unit, proceed to "Performing maintenance of the air filter unit" (⇒ page 112).

Note

• When using the projector, be sure to attach the air filter unit. If it is not attached, the projector will suck in dirt and dust causing a malfunction.

Performing maintenance of the air filter unit



1) Wash the air filter unit. (Fig. 1)

- i) Soak the air filter unit in cold or warm water and then lightly rinse it.
 - Do not use cleaning tools such as brushes.
 - When rinsing, hold the frame of the air filter unit without putting strong pressure on the filter.
- ii) Rinse the air filter unit two or three times with fresh water.
 - Insufficient rinsing may result in odors.

2) Dry the air filter unit. (Fig. 2)

- Let the air filter unit naturally dry off in a well-ventilated place where there is little dust and is not exposed to direct sunlight.
- Do not dry using drying devices such as dryers.
- After the air filter unit is dried, proceed to "Attaching the air filter unit" (→ page 113).

Attention


- After washing the air filter unit, dry it thoroughly before attaching it back to the projector. Attaching a wet unit will cause an electric shock or malfunction
- Do not disassemble the air filter unit.

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Note

Replace the air filter unit with a new optional Replacement Filter Unit (Model No.: ET-RFV410) if it is damaged or if the dirt does not come
off even after washing

Attaching the air filter unit



- 1) Attach the air filter unit to the projector. (Fig. 1)
 - Hold the air filter unit with the tab on the left side as shown in the figure, attach it from the right side, and push the tab until it clicks.
 - Do not press on the crease part of the air filter when pressing into place.
- 2) Attach the air filter cover to the projector.
 - Perform in the reverse order of the Step 2) of "Removing the air filter unit" (→ page 112) to close the air filter cover. Make sure to press the air filter cover firmly until it clicks into place.
 - When the air filter unit is attached to the projector, proceed to the "Resetting the air filter counter" (▶ page 113).

Note

• When using the projector, be sure to attach the air filter unit. If it is not attached, the projector will suck in dirt and dust causing a malfunction.

Resetting the air filter counter

- 1) Turn on the projector.
- 2) Press the <MENU> button on the remote control or the control panel.
 - The main menu screen is displayed.
- 3) Press ▲▼ to select [PROJECTOR SETUP].
- 4) Press the <ENTER> button.
 - The [PROJECTOR SETUP] screen is displayed.
- Press ▲▼ to select [FILTER COUNTER].
- 6) Press the <ENTER> button.
 - The [FILTER COUNTER] screen is displayed.
- 7) Press ▲▼ to select [FILTER COUNTER RESET] and press the <ENTER> button.
- 8) When the confirmation screen is displayed, press **♦** to select [OK], then press the **<ENTER>** button.
 - The [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [FILTER COUNTER] → [FILTER COUNTER] is displayed as "0H".

Note

• When the projector is used without resetting the filter counter, the actual filter usage time (counter numeric value) will not be able to be confirmed.

Replacement

Lamp unit

The lamp unit is a consumable component. Refer to "When to replace the lamp unit" (page 114) for details about the replacement cycle.

When purchasing the optional Replacement Lamp Unit (Model No.: ET-LAV400), consult your dealer. It is recommended to replace the lamp unit by a professional technician. Consult your dealer for details.

Warning

Replace the lamp unit after the lamp has cooled (after waiting at least one hour).

The high temperature inside the cover will cause burns.

Notes on the replacement of the lamp unit

- A Phillips screwdriver is required when replacing the lamp unit.
- Since the luminous lamp is made of glass, it may burst if dropped or hit with a hard object. Handle with care.
- Do not disassemble or modify the lamp unit.
- When replacing the lamp unit, be sure to hold it by the handle because its surface is pointed and its shape is protruded.
- The lamp may rapture. Replace the lamp unit carefully so that the glass fragments of the lamp do not scatter.
 While attaching the projector to the ceiling, do not work right under the lamp unit or do not conduct work while your face is near the lamp unit.
- The lamp contains mercury. When disposing of used lamp units, contact your local authorities or dealer for correct methods of disposal.

Attention

 Panasonic takes no responsibility for any damage or malfunction of the product resulting from use of lamp units which are not manufactured by Panasonic. Use only specified lamp units.



When to replace the lamp unit

The lamp unit is a consumable component. Since its brightness gradually decreases over time, it is necessary to replace the lamp unit regularly. The estimated duration before replacement is 5 000 hours, but the lamp may go off before reaching to 5 000 hours, depending on the characteristics of the individual lamp, usage conditions, and the installation environment. It is recommended that the Replacement Lamp Unit be prepared earlier.

If you continue to use the lamp unit after 5 000 hours has elapsed, the lamp turns off automatically after approximately 10 minutes, as it may cause malfunction of the projector.


Note

- To predict the lamp unit replacement time, convert the runtime of [NORMAL], [ECO1] and [ECO2], which are set from the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [LAMP POWER], to the equivalent runtime of [[NORMAL] respectively. After checking the runtime of [NORMAL], [ECO1] and [ECO2] displayed in the [PROJECTOR SETUP] menu → [STATUS] → [RUNTIME] → [LAMP (ET-LAV400)], calculate the converted runtime by referring to "Formula for lamp unit replacement time (rough estimate)". How to replace the lamp unit

Attention

- When the projector is mounted on a ceiling, do not work with your face close to the lamp unit.
- When replacing the lamp unit, do not remove or loosen the screws other than specified.
- Attach the lamp unit and the lamp cover securely.





1) After turning off the projector, remove the plug from the outlet.

• Wait at least one hour and make sure the lamp unit and surroundings have cooled down.

2) Remove the lamp cover. (Fig. 1)

• Turn the lamp cover fixing screw (×1) with the Phillips screwdriver in the counterclockwise direction until it turns freely, slowly slide the lamp cover in the direction of the arrow, and then remove it.

3) Remove the lamp unit. (Fig. 2)

- Turn the lamp unit fixing screws (×3) with a Phillips screwdriver in the counterclockwise direction until it turns freely, and remove lamp unit.
- Hold the handle of the lamp unit and take it straight out.
- Do not remove screws other than the lamp unit fixing screws.

4) Press in the new lamp unit while paying attention to the insertion position.

• If it is difficult to install the lamp unit, remove and reinstall it. The connector part may be damaged if it is pressed by force.

5) Use a Phillips screwdriver to firmly tighten the lamp unit fixing screws (x3).

Make sure to attach the lamp unit securely.

6) Attach the lamp cover.

- i) Perform Step 2) in the reverse order to attach the lamp cover.
- ii) Use a Phillips screwdriver to firmly tighten the lamp cover fixing screw (x1).
 - Make sure to attach the lamp cover slowly and securely.

Note

· When you replace the lamp unit with a new one, the projector resets the runtime of the lamp unit automatically.

Air filter unit

If dirt does not come off even after the air filter unit is cleaned, it is time for the unit to be replaced. The Replacement Filter Unit (Model No.: ET-RFV410) is an optional accessory. To purchase the product, consult your dealer.

Attention

- Make sure to turn off the power before replacing the filter. (⇒ page 42)
- · Make sure that the projector is stable, and perform the maintenance in a safe place even if the filter falls accidentally.

Note

• The replacement cycle of the air filter unit varies greatly depending on the usage environment.

How to replace the air filter unit

- 1) Remove the air filter unit.
 - Refer to "Removing the air filter unit" (→ page 112).
- 2) Install the optional Replacement Filter Unit (Model No.: ET-RFV410) to the projector.
 - Refer to "Attaching the air filter unit" (⇒ page 113).
- 3) Reset the air filter counter.
 - Refer to "Resetting the air filter counter" (⇒ page 113).

Attention

- When switching on the projector, make sure that the air filter unit is attached. If it is not attached, the projector will suck in dirt and dust
 causing a malfunction.


